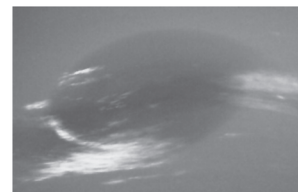
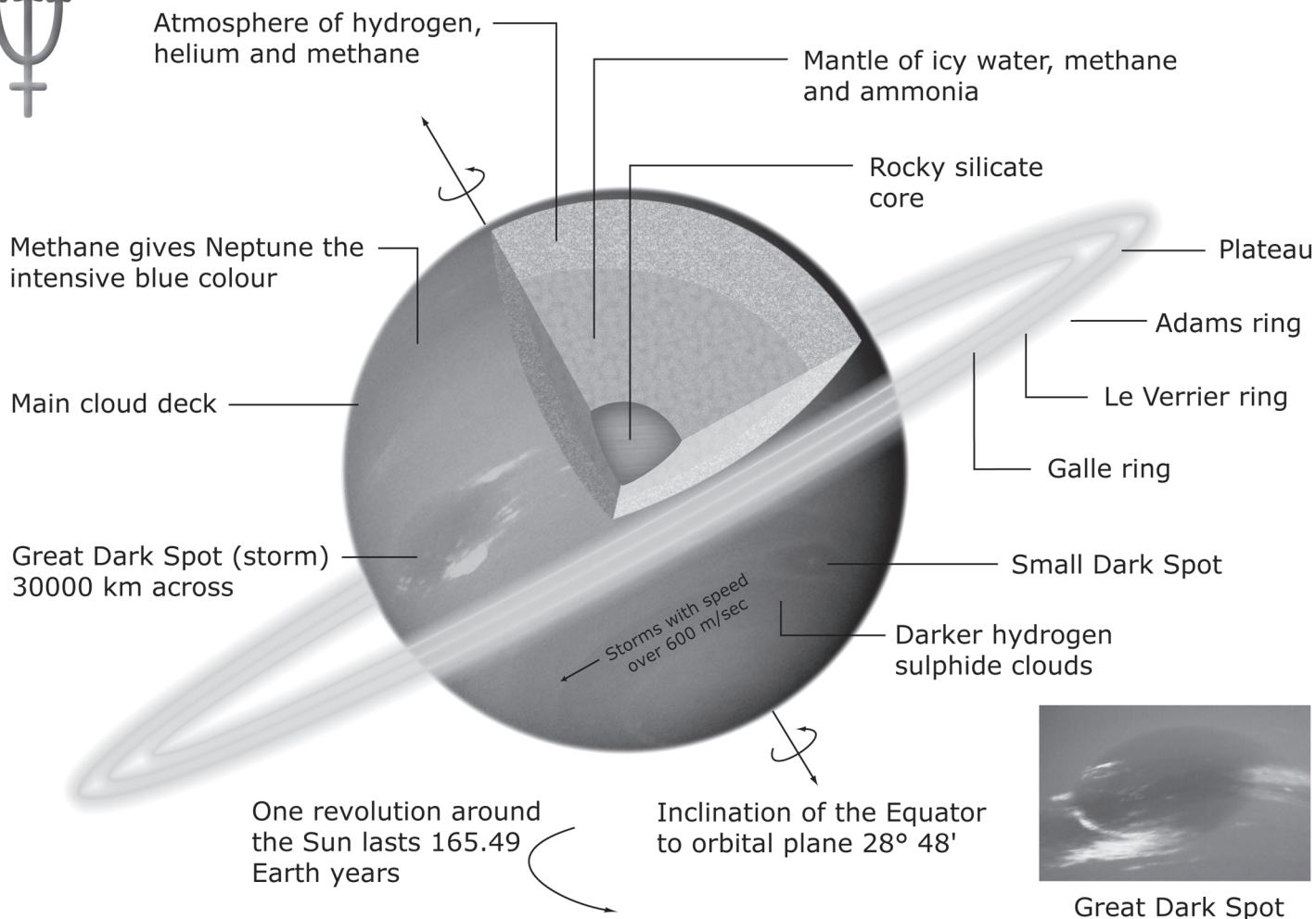
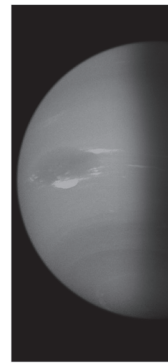
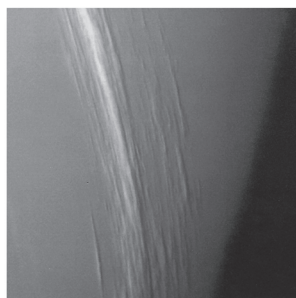


NEPTUNE

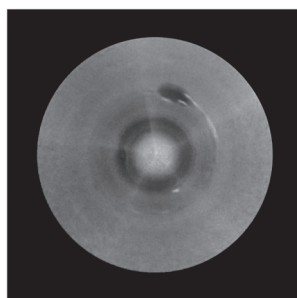

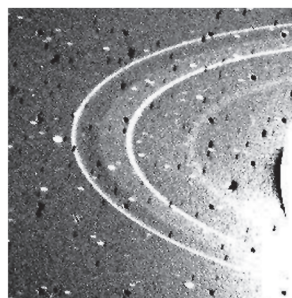
Great Dark Spot



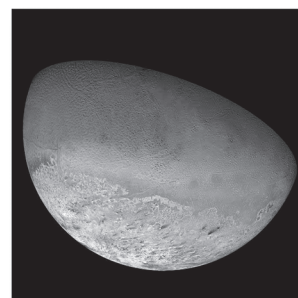
Clouds
