


Triton

Triton is Neptune's largest moon. In Greek mythology, it is the son of the God of the Sea, Poseidon. Triton has an unusually bright, icy surface. There are craters, rifts and icy volcanoes. Voyager 2 approached Triton to within 3000 km in 1989. Triton moves in a EAAE retrograde orbit and is most likely a captured Trans-Neptunian Object.









Cantaloupe Terrain (NASA Voyager 2)
