Claiming ORCID papers through ADS

A step-by-step guide

Intro

ORCID (Open Researcher and Contributor ID) provides a persistent digital identifier that distinguishes you from every other researcher and supports automated linkages between you and your professional activities, ensuring that your work is recognised and attributed to you.

ORCID is an **open, non-profit, community-based** effort to provide a registry of unique researcher IDs. It is not associated with any specific publisher, discipline, or geographic area. The use of ORCID is free of charge.

In order to set up an **account**, go to http://orcid.org/


An essential part of your ORCID profile is the **Works** section where your publications are listed. Instead of manually entering the bibliographic information of your papers, you can now populate your ORCID record through the **ADS**.



This step-by-step guide explains how.


1. Go to ADS Bumblebee

2. Log into ORCID

Select Sign in to ORCID from the pull-down menu in the upper right corner (black area).




3. Authorize ORCID to import papers from ADS


On the ORCID login screen, enter your email or ID along with your password, then click **Authorize** to allow communication between ORCID and ADS.



4. Log into your Bumblebee ADS account


If you would like to allow ADS to make your ORCID claims public, log into your **ADS Bumblebee account** (optional). Note that your ADS Classic account will not work here.






5. Already claimed ORCID papers

Once you are logged into ORCID (and ADS), you will see the list of your ORCID / ADS papers.



6. Search for your papers in ADS

To find further papers, carry out an author search for your publications.




The Author search form will already be **pre-filled** with your name.



7. Claim papers

You can now claim further papers from the results list and add them to your ORCID account.




Note:

Each paper has to be claimed individually. This way, ADS tries to ensure verification of papers before upload to ORCID.

8. Search ADS by ORCID
