Lists



The **Lists** button offers predefined bibliographies for certain topics. For instance, the list "ESO Operating Manuals" includes records of all ESO manuals.

Users can create new lists for topics of interest. Lists can be either "public" in order to share them with others, or "private". If you are logged into your library account, all catalog records will display the option "Save to Lists" so that items can be added with one click.

You can manage your lists and other features of your **library account** by clicking on your name at the top of the page.







It's easy: just use the **Self Checkout** button (1) next to the search field. Use your email address (without @eso.org) as **user ID** and **password** and enter the ID (barcode number on the back of the cover page of books, e.g., ML 1994 123456) of the item you want to borrow.

We are not applying strict loan periods; you can lend items until another user needs them, provided you keep them in your office. Please do not take library items home or on trips.
